How to get to the Region of Valencia?

3 international airports with more than 118 daily connections and 13 million passengers.



Transport network The region of Valencia has one of the best

The region of Valencia has one of the best transportation network, making it easy to travel around the region and beyond







By train

- Spain's high-speed rail service offers quick and easy connections to and from the main cities. The journey from Madrid to València city takes just 1 hour 36 minutes. One-way tickets cost upwards of 30 euros.
- The journey from Madrid to Alicante takes scarcely 2.5 hours and from Barcelona to Valencia less than 3 hours.

By road

- A-7: this highway connects the major cities in the region, such as Alicante, Castelló de la Plana and València
- AP-7: this toll road connects the Region of Valencia with other cities in Spain and France. The section from Altea-San Juan de Alicante to La Jonquera (Girona, on the border with France) is completely free.
- A-3: this highway conects with Madrid.

By port

- 3 ports (València, Alicante and Castelló de la Plana) with 360 cruises per year and around 1,016,242 passengers.
- València is a major port city, being one of the most important hub in Europe and the Spain's first port in terms of container traffic and fourth of Europe, handling 41% of Spain's exports and serving as a gateway to the rest of Spain.
